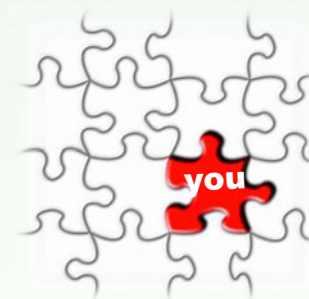

86 children and 56 adults received free **coats for the winter** through the 2009 Sierra Nevada Children's Services Coat Drive.

96 children had something to unwrap last holiday season because of the 2009 Sierra Nevada Children's Services Holiday Toy Drive and the **heartfelt generosity of this community**.

214 newly eligible families qualified for subsidized child care; a benefit that keeps local parents working.

118 children received individualized assessments to enhance the development opportunities for each child in child care.

332 families received child care resource and referral services.

1,020 children from **660 families** benefited from **quality subsidized care**.

209 families participated in **parenting and life skills workshops**; some were assisted with access to **healthcare**.

35 child care early learning facilities participated in evaluating their programs and **developing quality improvement plans**.

442 early care and education site visits were conducted to enhance learning environments for the children.

Sierra and Nevada counties have a combined child care capacity of 2,542 child care slots.

1,050 visits to the Sierra Nevada Children's Services Resource Library provided **child development materials** to expand young minds.

93 Bucket of Books site visits to early learning child care settings were made to promote literacy.

2,074 individuals received **technical assistance**:

- Parents, relatives or grandparents = 1,124
- Licensed family child care home care providers = 451
- Center based staff = 264
- License exempt providers = 193

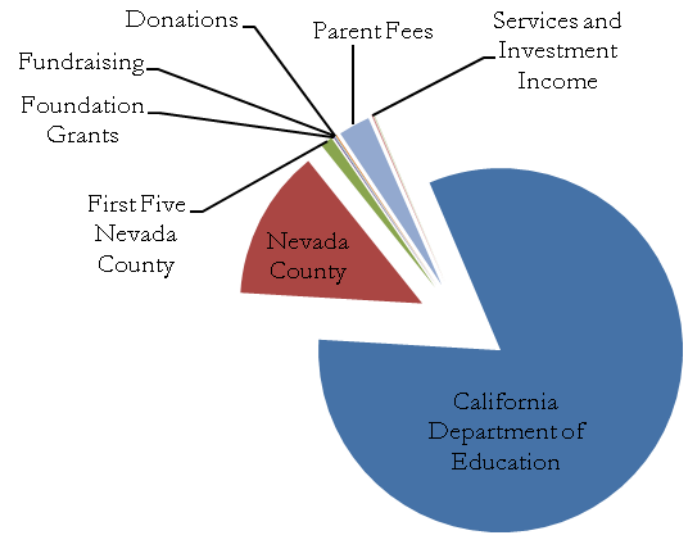
